## CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

"Final Exams"

In today's Scripture Jesus is giving us His teaching on judgment day. It is kind of like a test. I remember back in the day

when I had to study for tests. You could even consider this a “final exam”. Many people are prepping for their final exams this time of year. People in school, people in industry, even people who are having their sixteenth birthday. Let us see what He has to say.

Matthew tells us in chapter 25, verses 31 to 40, When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, He will sit on His throne in heavenly glory. All the nations will be gathered before Him, and He will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on His right and the goats on His left.

Then the King will say to those on His right, “Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me”.

Then the righteous will answer Him, “Lord when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?”

The King will reply, “I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did to me.” (NIV)

In Matthew chapter 25 Jesus gives us three parables or teachings on how to go to heaven. Now everyone wants to go to heaven, don't they?

The 1st parable is about “Ten Bridesmaid's”. It deals with being ‘spiritually prepared’.

Our spiritual preparation cannot be bought or borrowed. We must have a personal relationship with Jesus. Some may look ready – however God knows the heart.

The 2nd parable is often called the “Parable of the Talents”. This deals with ‘how to use our spiritual gifts’. You see our spiritual gifts are specific and personal. Now no one is overloaded with gifts. However, some of us are a little lazy. After all many of us are retired. Come to think of it this would be a good parable for each of us to review.

In the 3rd parable which is considered “Final Judgment” Jesus gives us some information on how judgment day will be structured. This parable requires all Christians to treat others as if they were Jesus. Not just the ones we like. Our enemies! The ones we do not like one bit. The ones we disagree with. The ones who lie to us and about us. The ones who persecute us. Those ‘others’. Isn't it interesting, Jesus' teaching on our final exam doesn't address our success, our education, how hard we worked, what we think or even how nice we are to friends. The exam criteria are ALL about what we did for others – even our enemies! Yes, I think Jesus is saying what we do matters. You see caring is Love in action!

Now please do not misunderstand me. We do not believe Jesus is saying anyone can work their way into heaven. The Reformation cry of ‘Sola Fide’, which is Latin for “Justification by Faith”, is still alive and well. What I am saying is “What we believe” impacts our actions. If we believe it is going to be cold - we wear warm clothing. If we believe we have an appointment – we prepare to go. If we believe our car needs repair – we take it to the shop. If we believe Jesus is the Christ, it impacts what we do and do not do, what we say and don't say, what we think and don't think. Therefore, what we believe changes us from the inside out. Christians are to be doing the work not just listening and nodding from the sideline.

Have you ever had an ‘open book test’? Good News, the final exam is an open book. Jesus was noticeably clear what His evaluation criteria will be:

1st – A personal relationship with Jesus the Christ?

2nd – Maintaining our relationship by growing thru: daily prayer, Bible study and Worship.

3rd – Using your spiritual gifts! Are you ready for your final exam? Remember passing the test is dependent upon our faithfulness - NOT how others respond. As you reflect on this reading remember you can always change the results. There is still time - the ultimate decision is yours!

### **VA CEMETERY INFO**

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) National Cemetery Administration (NCA) today announced it would lift all restrictions on gathering sizes at committal and memorial services in VA national cemeteries starting on Wednesday, May 26, 2021.

Earlier this week, the NCA announced it had adjusted its rules for visitors and staff members in accordance with the CDC's new guidance, Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People. Fully vaccinated persons are no longer required to wear masks and physically distance themselves while at a national cemetery.

Consistent with the new CDC guidance, NCA still requires persons who are not fully vaccinated to practice the safety procedures recommended by the CDC – such as wearing face coverings and maintaining physical distancing – while visiting a cemetery or attending a service.

Today in American Legion history:

May 4, 1950: American Legion donations help launch the National Association for Mental Health.

May 4, 2011: The American Legion National Executive Committee passes a resolution to establish The American Legion Amateur Radio Club in support of the organization's disaster-preparedness program, in

association with the Department of Homeland Security. The ham radio club is authorized a budget of \$1,000 to get started.

May 9, 1951: A 21-year-old combat veteran of the Korean War is denied admission into the Tucson, Ariz., VA Hospital because, as the director tells the media and American Legion members who take up the veteran's cause, "no returned veteran from Korea is eligible for hospital benefits unless he has been discharged from the service because of a duty disability." This nationally publicized story leads National Commander Erle Cocke, Jr., to call on Congress to expand VA health-care services, disability benefits and pensions to veterans of the Korean War to an equal footing as those received by World War II veterans. A joint resolution to that effect is swiftly passed and signed into law May 11, 1951
